<p>1</p> <h3>NOUN</h3> <p>A person, place, thing or idea.</p>  <p>Ex: The boy read a book.</p>	<p>2</p> <h3>PRONOUN</h3> <p>A word used in place of a noun.</p>  <p>Ex: She said he would help.</p>	<p>3</p> <h3>VERB</h3> <p>A word that shows an action or state of being.</p>  <p>Ex: They run every morning.</p>	<p>4</p> <h3>ADJECTIVE</h3> <p>A word that describes a noun.</p>  <p>Ex: The bright star shone at night.</p>	<p>5</p> <h3>ADVERB</h3> <p>A word that describes a verb, adjective or another adverb.</p>  <p>Ex: She ran quickly to catch the bus.</p>
<p>6</p> <h3>PREPOSITION</h3> <p>A word that shows position, direction or time.</p>  <p>Ex: The ball is in the box.</p>	<p>7</p> <h3>CONJUNCTION</h3> <p>A word that joins words, phrases or clauses.</p>  <p>Ex: I wanted tea but I stayed home.</p>	<p>8</p> <h3>INTERJECTION</h3> <p>A word that expresses strong feeling.</p>  <p>Ex: Wow! That was amazing!</p>	<p>9</p> <h3>DETERMINER</h3> <p>A word that introduces a noun and gives more information.</p>  <p>Ex: That dog is very friendly.</p>	<p>10</p> <h3>ARTICLE</h3> <p>A word that comes before a noun (a, an, the).</p>  <p>Ex: She found a shell on the beach.</p>
<p>11</p> <h3>SUBJECT</h3> <p>The person or thing that does the action.</p>  <p>Ex: The cat slept on the mat.</p>	<p>12</p> <h3>PREDICATE</h3> <p>The part of a sentence that tells what the subject does.</p>  <p>Ex: The cat slept on the mat.</p>	<p>13</p> <h3>OBJECT</h3> <p>A noun or pronoun that receives the action.</p>  <p>Ex: She kicked the ball.</p>	<p>14</p> <h3>DIRECT OBJECT</h3> <p>The object that receives the action directly.</p>  <p>Ex: I ate the apple.</p>	<p>15</p> <h3>INDIRECT OBJECT</h3> <p>The object that receives the action indirectly.</p>  <p>Ex: I gave my friend a gift.</p>
<p>16</p> <h3>PHRASE</h3> <p>A group of words that does not contain a subject and verb.</p>  <p>Ex: In the garden was beautiful.</p>	<p>17</p> <h3>CLAUSE</h3> <p>A group of words that contains a subject and verb.</p>  <p>Ex: She ran to the shop.</p>	<p>18</p> <h3>SIMPLE SENTENCE</h3> <p>A sentence with one independent clause.</p>  <p>Ex: It is raining.</p>	<p>19</p> <h3>COMPOUND SENTENCE</h3> <p>A sentence with two or more independent clauses.</p>  <p>Ex: It is raining, but I am happy.</p>	<p>20</p> <h3>COMPLEX SENTENCE</h3> <p>A sentence with one independent clause and one or more dependent clauses.</p>  <p>Ex: When it rains, we stay inside.</p>
