8. KEY VOCABULARY

Migration	The movement of people from one place to another.
Migrant	A person who migrates.
Origin	The place someone comes from.
Destination	The place someone moves to.
Push factor	A reason that pushes people to leave.
Pull factor	A reason that pulls people to move.
